In understanding the occasion, Tiffany was able to illustrate her needs and ultimately salvaged a multitude of possessions and people. In this situation, there were individuals who wanted a specific action to be taken, and with that goal in mind, were able to achieve what they intended on doing. She had a purpose, which was to save their neighbors and with the right intentions, you are able to get the expected

results (Yancey, 2009). In a situation where individuals actively consume literature by either provoking an action to be taken or are persuading individuals upon their emphasis towards the topic, they are gaining some sort of meaningful interaction with the literature. Their objective behind their interactions were accomplished when they had a set intention.
